Syracuse City School District Renovates School Incorporation Energy Efficiency Measures

Syracuse, Onondaga County

Background

The Syracuse City School District, Onondaga County, sought to renovate and expand the McKinley-Brighton Magnet School. It wanted to incorporate energy efficiency into the project starting at the planning stage. The goal of the School District was to reduce operating costs and improve the health and comfort for students and staff.

The Syracuse City School District contacted NYSERDA and applied for design and implementation assistance through the **New York Energy SmartSM** New Construction Program. Science Applications International Corporation (SAIC), a NYSERDA technical assistance consultant, worked with the project team including RSA Architects and Ram-Tech Engineers to complete an energy feasibility study.

Recommendations

This study identified economically feasible improvements, the associated savings, and an installation incentive. Recommended measures included:

- Variable air-volume ventilation systems with variable-speed drives on supply and return air fans
- Economizer control on air-handling units
- Carbon-dioxide sensors for ventilation control on gym and cafeteria air-handling units
- Lighting, occupancy sensors, premium-efficiency motors and ENERGY STAR[®] transformers
- Building Commissioning

Incentives and Results

NYSERDA’s incentive of **\$150,076** will help the Syracuse City School District achieve:

- Annual energy savings of \$55,593 (422,446 kWh)
- Peak summer-demand reduction of 97.8 kW
- Simple payback of 1.1 years
- Annual emissions reduction of more than 186 tons

New York Energy SmartSM

All **New York Energy SmartSM** programs are funded by a System Benefits Charge (SBC) paid by electric distribution customers of Central Hudson, Con Edison, NYSEG, Niagara Mohawk, Orange and Rockland, and Rochester Gas and Electric. NYSERDA, a public benefit corporation established by law in 1975, administers SBC funds and programs under an agreement with the Public Service Commission.

New York Energy SmartSM programs are designed to lower electricity costs by encouraging energy efficiency as the State’s electric utilities move to competition.
